Epsilon Omicron provided Jeff Jones '74, EO 779 with many things he lacked when he arrived at USC as a 17-year-old. "Sigma Nu gave me a chance to grow up and become a man. I learned real-life leadership skills. Sigma Nu was different than other fraternities at USC; sure, there was an occasional party but we also knew our priorities and stuck to them. It wasn't about who had the prettiest girlfriend, shiniest car, or who threw the best party. It was about the brotherhood."

"The original house was built in the 1930s, and when the addition was put on in the 1970s there was no update to the original plumbing or fixtures. It's still there and is in desperate need of replacement. In order to ensure Sigma Nu remains a viable part of the Greek community at USC, we must have support from all alumni."

To those who have not yet made a pledge Jeff says, "Take a minute to think about your EO experience. Did you have a good time? Did you make great friends? If you are like me, your answer to both questions is yes. If you want the same opportunity you had to be available to others, what are you waiting for? It's time to spread the wealth and pass it on.'

Jeff and his wife, Kris, whom he met at a fraternity TGIF during dental school, own a general dentistry practice in Aliso Viejo, California. Jeff is a dentist and Kris is his dental hygienist. They have three children: Kyle (26), Kevin (24), and Kelsey (21). Jeff is in his 13th year coaching the boy's and girl's pole vault teams at Aliso Niguel High School and is a U.S. Army reservist as a dental officer. He reports that he will miss this year's EO Plaque Banquet because he will be in the Dominican Republic doing humanitarian dentistry for citizens who do not have access to dental services.
